[This four-page brief](#) summarizes the results of sophisticated computer modeling used by the Center for Decision Science, Harvard School of Public Health to estimate the cost and health impact of cervical cancer prevention in low- and lower-middle-income countries, including both HPV vaccination and screening and preventive treatment. [The full report](#) includes figures for all regions while this brief highlights sections of the report focusing on countries with per capita GDPs under US\$2,585. The study was funded by CCA co-chair the American Cancer Society.
